This is an example of the USM yant after it has been handomized. Mate how after handomization, there are different instances of the same letter depending an whether it is at the beginning of a word, at the end, ar in the middle. Mate, too, that letters connect much better when following letters which normally connect to the next letter above the baseline, namely "y", "a", "v", and "w". All of these problems were yived by the handomizer program. The handomizer program makes the proper substitutions at the beginning of words, and the end, and yor letter pairs involving "4", "a", "v", and "w". your handwriting yout may also Contain multiple Versions of Common letters like the valuels, and if so the handomizer will substitute in handom versions of those letters. Also, if there are any idiosyntralies in your handwriting, the handomizer can substitute in the correct versions of letters to deal with it. Sar instance, in the sample of the Slightower yant, note that letters with descenders such as g, y, y, etc., are usually followed by letters having an especially long leading stem going underneath the preceding Character. But note that this is not the case with the "xelly" yeart. The randomizer took care of this automatically.
