This is an example of the leage fort after it has been randomized. Note how after randomization, there are different instances of the same letter depending on whether it is at the beginning of a word, at the end, or in the middle. Note, too, that letters connect much better when following letters which normally connect to the next letter above the breseline, namely "b", "o", "o", and "w". Ill of these problems were fixed by the randomizer program. The randomizer program makes the proper substitutions at the beginning of words, and the end, and for letter pairs involving "b", "o", "o", and "w". Jour handwriting fort may also contain multiple versions of common letters like the vowels, and if so the randomizer will substitute in random versions of hose letters. Also, if here are any idiosyneweies in your handwriting, the randomizer can substitute in the concert versions of letters to deal with it. For instance, in the sample of the Rightower fort, note that letters with descenders such as "g", "f", "y", etc., are usually followed by letters having an especially long leading stem going underreath the preceding character. But note that his is not the case with the "Kelly" font. The randomizer took care of this automatically.
